

2023 Scholarship Program Guidelines & Official Rules

Objective: To provide financial assistance to eligible cooperative youth to help further their education

PROGRAM OUTLINE: Shelby Electric Cooperative (SEC) will award three \$1,000 scholarships to eligible applicants. Scholarships are readily available for one year and are not renewable. Scholarships will be awarded based on academic and community involvement, character, and financial need as demonstrated in the application and essay. All applicants for scholarships shall be considered on the listed criteria without regard to race, age, color, religion, gender, national origin, or existence of a physical handicap.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:

-Eligible youth are sons or daughters of a current Shelby Electric Cooperative member who is receiving electric service from the cooperative at the time the scholarship application is submitted -Eligible youth must be a high school senior graduating during the 2022-2023 academic year -Eligible youth must go on to further their educational experience at an accredited four-year or two-year college or university in the United States, including vocational/technical schools -Eligible winners must begin undergraduate studies within one year of notification that they have won the scholarship

-Eligible winners must enroll as "full time" students and maintain a minimum of 12 credit hours

DEADLINE: Completed applications must be received by the end of business, March 7, 2022. Applications may be received via mail at <u>Shelby Electric Cooperative, Attn: SEC Scholarship Program,</u> <u>PO Box 560, Shelbyville, IL 62565</u> or via email at <u>scholarship@shelbyelectric.coop.</u>

NOTIFICATION: Scholarship winners will be notified in May and will be requested to attend Shelby Electric Cooperative's Annual Meeting of Members on June 9, 2023 to receive their certificate.

CONDITIONS: Winners must provide proof of enrollment to Faith Wheeler, Member Services Specialist, at fwheeler@shelbyelectric.coop before the scholarship is awarded.

NOTE: Please do <u>NOT</u> submit additional materials other than those requested per the application. Additional materials including but not limited to letters of recommendation and school acceptance letters are <u>not part of the judging process and will be discarded.</u>
